PARENTAL NOTIFICATION

Under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

Under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) makes it a requirement for the State Educational Agency (SEA) to make certain information available to parents of children in public schools and to parents of children in private schools who are receiving federal financial assistance. The law requires SEAs to provide parents with certain information and to obtain their consent and assent before certain actions are taken. The law also requires SEAs to provide parents with information about their rights and responsibilities, including the right to sue for damages if the SEA fails to comply with the law.

Written complaint procedures appropriate to private school officials or representatives, adequate information about the State Educational Agency's (SEA) written complaint procedures for resolving issues of violation of a federal statute or regulation that applies to private schools receiving federal financial assistance.

Teacher qualifications and non-highly qualified teachers - SEAs shall ensure that each public school provides notice to parents related to the highly qualified status of their child's teacher. No longer be required to provide notice to parents of each teacher's highly qualified status.
